
Strategy 2025 & Beyond

Introduction

In 2025 we celebrate 150 years of Loreto education in Australia. Our educational legacy, based on the charism and spirituality of Mary Ward, stretches back over 400 years.

The vision of Mother Mary Gonzaga Barry and the pioneer Loreto Sisters who arrived in Australia in 1875 is as relevant today as it was in our beginnings. Sharing their faith and commitment to the provision of an exceptional education, Loreto Mandeville Hall Toorak is a school that educates, forms and challenges students for themselves and for others. Consequently, our students become strong, intelligent and generous young women who find their way in our world with a sense of freedom and justice, imbued with sincerity, verity and felicity.

While our past and present are important to us, so is the future. In this Strategic Plan we outline a framework that upholds our Loreto values and builds upon them in a way that is contemporary, forward-looking and relevant to the lives of the students who will become our graduates.

The five core values of *Felicity, Freedom, Justice, Sincerity* and *Verity* underpin Mary Ward's spirituality and define our approach to a Loreto education. Felicity, Freedom, Justice, Sincerity and Verity weave their way inter-connectedly through the life of our School and community.

Felicity is an attitude of mind and a disposition of the heart which manifests itself in a sense of joy and hope. Living with Felicity calls us to embrace optimism and positivity. Good humour, inclusivity and openness to friendship marks Felicity as a central characteristic of our School community.

Mary Ward's understanding of **Freedom** was grounded in her sense of a personal relationship with God. She believed that each person has free and open access to God and can find God in the ordinary experiences of each day. Freedom, personal agency and an authentic voice are essential to human flourishing.

Mary Ward's sense of **Justice** is grounded in a "right relationship" with God, with other people, and with the whole of creation. Work for justice entails the search for equality, the protection of human rights, and our valuing of human dignity. It is informed by Catholic Social Teaching and the gospels and is essential to a Loreto education.

Sincerity is concerned with our personal honesty and the way in which we hold ourselves in our communications and relationships. Mary Ward's ideal was that we examine our interior life and know ourselves as God knows us. Sincerity calls us to live authentically, matching word and deed, to reflect our inner selves in our outer actions.

Verity, in Mary Ward's words, embodies integrity, particularly the profound truth of who we are and what gives meaning to our lives. This is centred fundamentally on our faith in God. Verity invites us to share our light with others and to provide leadership on the journey of life, as seekers of truth.
